

Using the Youth Council



The Charlotte-Mecklenburg Youth Council is a valuable resource, especially on issues, policies, and decisions impacting children and youth. Among other things, the youth council helps Charlotte-Mecklenburg to be a livable community that is:

- Welcoming, helping young people to learn about their community
- Prepared, educating a future workforce
- Resilient, developing a new generation of leaders
- Inclusive, giving young stakeholders a seat at the table (25% of Mecklenburg County population is under 18 years of age)

City, County, and CMS officials have committed to directly engage with the Youth Council, and actively and routinely solicit and use youth feedback and recommendations on current issues, strategic goals, budgets, and other relevant City/County/CMS work.

Suggested ways to utilize the Youth Council include:

- Refer current issues for youth council recommendations
- Solicit youth council feedback on budget priorities and strategic goals
- Use the youth council, and their communitywide networks, to highlight or share information about City/County/CMS initiatives and leadership
- Attend designated youth council meetings and activities
- Enable youth council members to explore public service careers through informal job shadowing of staff and officials
- Ask youth council members to serve on task forces and committees
- Invite youth council members to participate in civic events

Note: Youth council members are eager to engage via dialogue, email, surveys, social media, and other methods. Due to school, sports, after school activities, work, family, and transportation considerations, youth council members' time is limited. While the Youth Council may not be able to address every issue or attend every meeting, we will work with you to effectively and efficiently maximize this resource for you.

Through the youth council, a diverse network of student leaders meets regularly to learn about civic issues, leadership, and local government, and engage with and advise community leaders on issues, policies, and decisions impacting children and youth.
