What does Hillary Clinton believe? Where the candidate stands on 10 issues

No other 2016 candidate possesses a political resume quite like Hillary Clinton's.

Hillary Rodham Clinton owns a singular resume: first lady, senator and secretary of state. She is also a lawyer who worked on the Watergate investigation and a four-decade veteran of campaigns. Add two-time presidential contender. She's also the only Clinton to win the lowa caucuses. Here is a look at where Clinton stands on 12 key issues.

Education: Make public college debt-free. Fund universal pre-K. Against No Child Left Behind. Position unknown on Common Core.

Guns: Ban several types of assault weapons. Repeal protections for gun makers. Create a comprehensive background check system and close loopholes.

Healthcare: Give the government a role is setting insurance rates. Expand Obamacare but do not attempt to create a universal healthcare system now.

Immigration: Continue DACA and DAPA programs to waive deportation and expand them. Give undocumented residents a path to legal status.

Jobs and Wages: \$275 billion stimulus plan. Tax credits for jobs. Raise federal minimum wage to \$12 an hour.

Marijuana: "Wait and see" on overall legalization.

Taxes: A series of targeted tax credits for the middle class. Raise capital gains taxes.

Israel: Work toward a two-state solution. Do not necessarily freeze settlement building.

Iran: Support framework for nuclear deal. Continue diplomacy efforts and some sanctions.

Islamic State: No boots on the ground. Use regional troops.

What does Bernie Sanders believe? Where the candidate stands on 10 issues

The Sanders campaign is hoping that the senator's support from younger fans will turn into votes.

Brooklyn-born Bernie Sanders <u>marched on Washington in 1963</u>, moved to Vermont the next year and ultimately ran six statewide races there (lost four, won two). The nation's only socialist (he currently says democratic socialist) member of Congress tells high school students to <u>argue with their parents and teachers</u> and is an ardent anti-war activist who fought for <u>military veterans</u>. He has been a <u>popular mayor</u>, a Senate committee chairman, an early <u>social media and filibuster phenomenon</u> and he once recorded a folk album in the style of William Shatner.

Here is where he stands on 10 key issues.

Campaign finance: Limit corporate and interest-group spending in campaigns.

Climate change: Charge companies for carbon emissions.

Education: Free, universal preschool. Free tuition at public colleges and universities.

Federal Reserve and banks: Break up big banks. Open up the Fed.

Guns: Ban assault weapons. Repeal law protecting some gun manufacturers. No federal handgun waiting period.

Healthcare: Launch universal, government-provided health care.

Immigration: Offer path to citizenship. Waive some deportations now.

Taxes: Raise income tax rates for those making over \$250,000. Tax capital gains the same as dividends from work.

Iraq, Islamic State and Afghanistan: Opposed the Iraq war. Calls for troop withdrawal as soon as possible.

Iran and Israel: Supports current deal with Iran. Critical of Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's speech to Congress.

Education	Wants to implement school choice, empower local school districts, encourage innovation, reward good teachers, and allow for a simpler, streamlined student loan process. (BenCarson.com)
Economy	Believes that restoring free market policies, implementing a simpler, flat tax system, reducing the regulatory burden on businesses and reducing government debt will rapidly increase economic growth and jobs, allowing more people to achieve the American Dream. (BenCarson.com)
Crime/Justice	Says the death penalty should be decided on a state-by-state basis. Believes that more people are being incarcerated than is necessary and that there should be programs that will prevent them from re-entering the prison system. (BenCarson.com)

What does Ben Carson believe? Where the candidate stands on 10 issues

Ben Carson speaks at the Conservative Political Action Conference in February. The neurosurgeon said Sunday he will seek the GOP nomination for the White House.

He is a <u>pioneering brain surgeon</u> and the holder of high accolades, including the Presidential Medal of Freedom (2008), the designation as a "Living Legend" by the Library of Congress (2001) and five dozen honorary degrees. Ben Carson credits his mother for his education and the Bible for steering him away from violence. He is a Detroit native, a bestselling author and a Washington Times columnist. He's also <u>impressed the Wall Street Journal</u> editorial board. Here is where Carson stands on 10 key issues.

Climate change: The climate change debate is "irrelevant." Temperature change is cyclical.

Education: No federally-determined standards. We need more school choice.

Guns: Few limits on ownership except for the mentally ill or those convicted of violent crime.

Health care: Replace the Affordable Care Act with health savings accounts.

Immigration: Allow undocumented residents access to a national guest worker program if they leave the country first.

Marijuana: There are some benefits to medical marijuana. Legalizing for recreational purpose raises concern.

Social issues: The Supreme Court ruling on gay marriage is the law of the land.

Taxes: Establish a flat tax. Eliminate the IRS.

Iran and Israel: Congress must be involved in Iran deal. U.S. should listen to and consider Netanyahu's words.

Islamic State: The U.S. should step up its efforts to destroy the Islamic State militant group. Do not "tie" the military's hands.

Education	Wants to abolish the U.S. Department of Education and immediately end Common Core. (TedCruz.org)
Economy/Jobs	Wants to reduce regulations so that businesses can grow. Believes that small businesses are being crushed by encroaching regulations. Wants to get the "government out of the way so the people can do what they do best — innovate, expand, and create new jobs." (TedCruz.org)
Crime/Justice	Supports the Second Amendment right to bear arms (guns) for citizen protection. Supports stronger immigration laws to reduce numbers of people with criminal records from entering the country. (TedCruz.org)
Immigration	Says border security is national security. Wants to reform legal immigration to protect American workers. Plans to build a wall that works, triple border security, and put in place the surveillance and biometric tracking to secure the border. (TedCruz.org)
Security/Terrorism	Will rebuild the military, defeat ISIS, and repeal Obama's Iran deal. (TedCruz.org)

Environment	Will end the EPA regulations like the Waters of the U.S. rule and the Clean Power Plan that burden small businesses and farmers. Believes an all-of-the-above energy approach can embrace the bountiful resources in the US. Wants to open up abundant and affordable gas and electricity resources. Will approve the Keystone Pipeline. (TedCruz.org)
Social Issues	Has drafted legislation to protect the rights of states to define marriage. (TedCruz.org)
Taxes	Proposes the Cruz Simple Flat Tax, where all income groups would see a double-digit increase in after-tax income. The current seven rates of personal income tax would collapse into a single low rate of 10 percent. For a family of four, the first \$36,000 would be tax-free. (TedCruz.org)

What does Ted Cruz believe? Where the candidate stands on 10 issues

WASHINGTON — Ted Cruz is senator, firebrand, former prosecutor, the son of a preacher-man (who was also a Cuban emigre), a Tea Party favorite and now a closely-watched presidential candidate. To begin the season of decision, here is a look at where the Republican contender stands on ten key issues.

The Budget and debt: Mandate a balanced budget.

Corporations: End corporate income tax. End some programs like the Export-Import bank and federal subsidies for renewable fuels.

Common Core: End it.

Immigration: Block any current effort that lets undocumented immigrants legally remain in the U.S.

The Internet: Do not tax access to the Internet and block "net neutrality."

Obamacare: Repeal it.

Social Issues: Only the four states specifically named in the Supreme Court decision on gay marriage must abide by the ruling. In general, states should be allowed to define "marriage."

Taxes and the IRS: Move toward a flat tax and abolish the IRS.

Iran: Increase and toughen sanctions. End current nuclear talks until Congress approves the outlines of a deal.

Islamic State: Don't send U.S. ground troops, yet. But use overpowering force otherwise, including "carpet-bombing."

What does John Kasich believe? Where the candidate stands on 10 issues

Potential Republican 2016 presidential candidate Ohio Governor John Kasich speaks at the First in the Nation Republican Leadership Conference in Nashua, New Hampshire, April 18, 2015.

He is the grandson of coal miners and immigrants and a prodigy politician who talked his way into a <u>meeting with then-President Richard Nixon at age 18</u> and won his first election at age 24 (state senate). John Kasich spent nearly two decades in Congress and won re-election as Ohio governor by a whopping 30 points last year. He helped write the country's first balanced budget in decades (1997), worked as a television contributor for Fox, wrote three New York Times bestsellers and once was <u>kicked out of a Grateful Dead concert</u> for trying to get on stage. Here is where John Kasich stands on 10 key issues.

Climate Change: Climate change is real. The EPA should not regulate emissions.

Criminal Justice: Less prison time for nonviolent offenders. Focus on rehabilitation and treatment.

Education: Continue Common Core. Cut education spending.

Immigration: Allow undocumented immigrants to stay in the country legally. A path to citizenship is not preferable but may be part of compromise.

Obamacare: Keep the federal Medicaid expansion. Repeal and replace the rest of the Affordable Healthcare Act.

Social issues: It's time to move on from the same-sex marriage debate.

Taxes: Cut income and corporate taxes. Close some loopholes. Raise other taxes, including a state tax on fracking.

Unions and workers: Limit union powers, especially for public employees.

Iran and Israel: Iran deal raises concerns.

Islamic State and Iraq: Put U.S. boots on the ground to fight ISIS.
